Day 1: Read Commentary Notes

2. What did you learn from the lecture?

Day 2: Read Revelation 19:6-10 [\[Open NIV\]](#) [\[Open NKJV\]](#)

(Note: The word “Alleluia” or “Hallelujah” means “praise the Lord” and is used 22 times in the book of Psalms, but only occurs in the New Testament four times, all in Revelation 19:1-6.)

3. Why is the great multitude in heaven praising the Lord in verse 6?
4. **Thought Question:** What do you believe it means for the “Lord God Almighty” to reign?
5. **Personal Question:** Write down tangible evidence that the Lord God Almighty reigns in your life.
6. What great event is referenced in verse 7? What is given to the bride in verse 8 and what is significant about what is given to the bride?

Day 3: Read Matthew 22:1-14, Romans 13:14, Galatians 3:26-27 [\[Open NIV\]](#) [\[Open NKJV\]](#)

(Note: David Jeremiah writes, “In the first century, there were usually three steps to follow from the time of betrothal of a young couple until the final marriage union. First, the parents of the bride and the bridegroom negotiated a marriage contract, usually when the couple was very young. They were legally married, although there was no sexual contact for years. This betrothal was not like the engagement period today; it was much more binding. The second step in this marriage took place when the bridegroom, accompanied by some friends, went to the bride's house to take her back to his own home. Finally, the bridal procession would be followed by the marriage feast, which would last for many days.”)

10. What happened to the man at the wedding banquet who was not wearing wedding clothes?
(Note: 1st century Jewish custom required the host of the wedding banquet to distribute wedding robes to his guests.)

11. **Thought Question:** Apparently, the man found at the banquet without proper wedding attire refused the robe offered by the king. What spiritual truth is expressed by the man coming to the banquet without the proper clothing? (Hint: Refer to Romans 13:14 and Galatians 3:26 and 27 for your answer.)

12. **Personal Question:** Would you say that you have been “clothed with Christ?” Why or why not?

Day 4: Read Revelation 19:11-16 [\[Open NIV\]](#) [\[Open NKJV\]](#)

13. Describe the One John saw riding on a white horse.

14. (Note: In the Bible, a name usually represents a character trait or attribute.) John refers to this rider of the white horse with several names in today’s verses. List those names and the significance beside each.

15. **Thought Question:** Based on the names John used for this rider of the white horse, who is the rider?

16. **Personal Question:** Take a few moments to quietly reflect on the character of Jesus and then write down some names that come to your mind that are appropriate for Him.

Day 5: Read Revelation 19:17-21, Revelation 19:6-9 [\[Open NIV\]](#) [\[Open NKJV\]](#)

17. According to verses 17 and 18, what role would the birds play?
18. Contrast what happens in Revelation 19:6-9 with what happens in Revelation 19:17-18. Describe the fate of each group from the two texts mentioned.

Day 6: Read Daniel 11:41-45, Zephaniah 1:14-18, Zechariah 14:1-5, Galatians 5:17, Ephesians 2:1-3, James 4:4, Ephesians 2:13-18 [\[Open NIV\]](#) [\[Open NKJV\]](#)

(Note: Dwight Pentecost writes of the final earthly battle, “The kings of the earth and the whole world are to be gathered together through the activity of the trinity from hell to what is called the ‘battle of the great day of God Almighty’ (Revelation 16:14). This confluence of the nations of the earth is in a place called Armageddon (Revelation 16:15). There, God deals in judgment with the nations because of their persecution of Israel (Joel 3:2), because of their sinfulness (Revelation 19:15), and because of their godlessness (Revelation 16:9).”)

21. This final battle was prophesied in the Old Testament. Write something you learn about the final earthly war from the following OT verses:
